

## Grant Recipient Presentation



Tina Burns, a longtime employee with Shenandoah Community Health (SCH), spoke to our club last week about the grant money that was awarded during last year's grant cycle. Burns began her work at Shenandoah Community Health as a medical interpreter and progressed through other administrative roles during her 40 years of employment. Currently, she serves as the agency's director of resource development, where she is committed to promoting the efforts of the Shenandoah Community Health Foundation in raising funds to support Shenandoah Community Health.

In her work, she collaborates with community partners to help address the needs of those underserved in the community and to advocate for health and wellness issues in multiple arenas, including the legislative arena. SCH requested \$20k in our 2024 grant cycle and they were awarded the entire amount.

The goal of the Rotary project was to increase access to care at Healthy Smiles Community Oral Health Center, especially for pediatric patients, with the purchase of dental equipment that would enhance efficiency and quality of care and to introduce a new service procedure to the practice. The equipment included a replacement dental chair with accompanying equipment, enough slow-speed handpieces for each of the dentists, and a Diode Laser to initiate new soft tissue procedures with a focus on children.

The program exceeded expectations with a 15% increase in the number of children treated at Healthy Smiles during the grant period in comparison to the same period the previous year. The increase was largely due to the improved patient flow from having an adequate number of Slow-speed handpieces for the dentists to work efficiently and to the installation of the new dental chair to replace one no longer usable.





# PRIDE MONTH



**What is LGBTQ Prime Month?**

LGBTQ Pride Month is the positive stance against discrimination and violence toward lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender and queer (LGBTQ) people.

The month is dedicated to promote self-affirmation, dignity and equality rights, as well as aims to increase the LGBTQ visibility as a social group while celebrating sexual diversity and gender variance



**Why is it Called "Pride"**

Pride, as opposed to shame and social stigma, is the outlook that bolsters most LGBTQ rights groups and movements around the world.

Pride has lent its name to LGBTQ-themed events, organizations, institutes, book titles, foundations, a cable TV station, and the Pride Library.



**Why is Pride Month in June?**

Early on the morning of Saturday, June 28, 1969, police raided a gay bar in New York City, known as the Stonewall Inn.

The event brought on a series of riots by LGBTQ persons, constituting as the most important event leading to the gay liberation movement and modern fight for LGBTQ rights in the US.

The month of June was chosen to honor and commemorate those Stonewall riots.



**Who is the "Mother of Pride"?**

Brenda Howard is known as the "Mother of Pride", for her work in the coordinating the first LGBTQ Pride march to commemorate the first anniversary of the Stonewall riots.

Howard also originated the idea of a week-long series of events around Pride Day which became the genesis of the annual LGBTQ Pride festive celebrations that are now held around the world every June.



**How is it Celebrated?**

LGBTQ Pride Month events draw millions of participants from around the world each year.

Today, the month-long celebrations include pride parades, marches, parties, concerts/shows, workshops, symposiums and rallies across the entire nation.
